<p>Learning Options for Watertown-Mayer PreK-12 Students</p>	<p>Students at Watertown-Mayer will have the following learning options available to them:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● In-Person Learning<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ All students in grade PreK-12 will return to in-person learning, five days a week.● Full Time Online Learning<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ K-12 families also have the option to take part in full-time online learning through our partnership with Southwest Intermediate District. For more information, please reference the Southwest Metro e-Learning “Elevate” website.
<p>Prevention & Mitigation Strategies</p>	<p>Masks/Face Coverings</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Masks/Face Coverings will not be required inside or outside of Watertown-Mayer District facilities. Students and staff who choose to wear masks in school will be welcomed by all.● Throughout the school year the district will continue to monitor positive COVID-19 case rates through continued communication with MDH. We will communicate to staff and families if changes are necessary during the school year. <p>Social Distancing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Social distancing is not required and there are currently no group size limits. <p>COVID-19 Symptoms and Confirmed Cases</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Families and staff should continue to monitor and look for COVID-19 symptoms and stay home from school when showing symptoms or feeling ill.● Report any COVID-19 symptoms and/or positive cases immediately.<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Employees report to your supervisor.○ Students and families please report COVID-19 positive cases to the front office of your school building.● Individuals who test positive must stay home for at least 5 days from symptom onset (Day 0), or if they are asymptomatic, at least 5 days from the testing date (Day 0). Individuals who have tested positive may return to school after 5 full days at home (return between days 6 - 10) if

	<p>they follow these expectations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Follow the list of expectations in CDC isolation guidelines ○ Wear a well-fitting mask when around others until day 10. If a face covering can not be worn properly or the individual refuses to wear a face covering, the staff or student must remain in isolation for the entire 10 days ○ Fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication ○ Other symptoms have improved ○ Individuals with symptoms should continue to isolate for the full 10 days. ○ Additional guidance for return to athletics <p>Quarantine & Contact Tracing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Quarantined students will receive instruction similar to other long-term absences and follow student absentee protocols. ● Contact Tracing will only be done if required by MDH. <p>Vaccinations</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Watertown-Mayer Public Schools will not require COVID-19 vaccinations for the 2022-2023 school year, but they are strongly encouraged by MDH. ● Those who have not been vaccinated will not be segregated from any school populations and will be welcomed by all. <p>Testing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● MDH and CDC recommend testing for anyone with one of the more common COVID-19 symptoms or two of the less common symptoms ● CDC recommends all those, vaccinated and unvaccinated, who have been exposed to a person with COVID-19, be tested 5 days after exposure, even if asymptomatic.
<p>Student Support and Services</p>	<p>All student support programs and services will continue as usual next year for students attending school in-person and online. Students receiving special education, English Language, mental health, and other academic and/or social emotional support will continue to have access to these programs throughout the year.</p>
<p>Technology Services</p>	<p>Kindergarten - 4th Grade</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Students in grades K-4 will have school-issued devices at school ● Kindergarten -1st grade students will have iPads ● 2nd - 4th grade students will have Chromebooks <p>5th - 12th Grade</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 5th - 12th grade students will have <u>three</u> options for device obtainment: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Utilize a personal, family-owned device ○ Borrow a district-owned Chromebook.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> o Participate in the Best Buy dual-funded program and purchase a discounted device.
Transportation Services	<p>Bus transportation will be offered as usual for students during the 22-23 school year. The district will continue working closely with our transportation providers to follow the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC, MDH, and local health officials.
